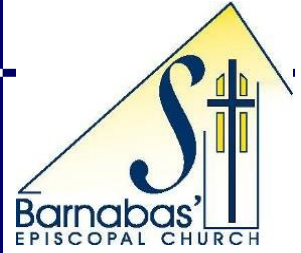

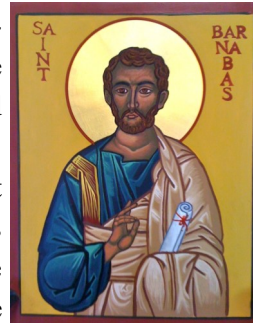

Happily, we seem to have survived another election season. Irrespective of one's political views, I suspect we are unanimous in our delight that Election Day has come and gone. Every year I think there must be a better way!

This year I heard someone asked why we are or are not praying for the President of the United States. This seems like a good time to say at least two things. First, we change the intercessions on a seasonal basis and aim to reflect the theme of a particular season. Some forms of the prayers invite us to pray for our leaders by name, and some have a different focus, most recently stewardship. Second, we pray for all of our leaders on a pretty regular basis for reasons that have nothing to do with whether or not we like them, voted for them, or support their various agendas. Our civic leaders at every level are servants of their people, trustees of our local, state, and national governments, and caretakers of the environment and its creatures. On All Saints' Day the intercessions included "Louis, king of France; Margaret, queen of Scotland; Gandhi the mahatma; and Dag Hammarskjold, the bureaucrat; *and all who made governance an act of faith.*" (Emphasis supplied.) Every exercise of governance is an act of faith, or lack thereof, and an act of stewardship, for good or ill. It isn't often that I am truly horrified by someone's election, but when that happens I pray for them all the more, precisely *because* I suspect they need it!



As I write this article our government is weighing what a tax bill might look like. The decisions will reflect our spiritual maturity and our struggle with scarcity and abundance. In case you are interested in what our faith bring to this conversation, here is the position we, The Episcopal Church, have taken.

Resolution Number: 2012-A080

Resolved, That the 77th General Convention of The Episcopal Church commit to working toward a just and fair system of taxation and government funding by affirming the following Scriptural principles for our advocacy in connection with the support of government, the distribution of the burdens of that support, and the stewardship of those resources:

Every Christian has an obligation to financially support lawfully constituted governments and to comply fully with the tax laws which apply to him or her, and to the organizations of which they are a part; and

Tax laws should impose proportional burdens on those with higher incomes and larger resources, in keeping with the Bible's teaching that God favors the poor; and

Those entrusted with public resources must act as good stewards; and

Recognizing the great disparities in wealth and opportunity in our society, Christians should insist that our governments seek economic justice, emphasizing the care and protection of the most vulnerable – the poor, the hungry, the sick – people for whose care Christ has taught us we are responsible, both through private efforts and through the collective work of our elected government.

Vestry Highlights - November 2017

Finance – The Finance Committee has worked on a first draft of a Parish Budget for 2018, which will be presented to the Parish at the Annual Meeting on Sunday, November 19. It is expected to recommend support for several new initiatives.

The Stewardship Campaign has had excellent results, with an increase of 26% in pledges over 2017, including several new pledges.

The Interim Rector explained the Virginia Plan, adopted by the Diocese of Virginia in the 1950's, which asks all parishes in the Diocese to pledge 10-12% of their pledge income to the Diocese, and 1% of pledge income to Episcopal Seminary support. The Vestry voted to pledge 11% of 2018 pledge income to the Diocese and 1% of pledge income to seminaries.

We have had discussions with the Bailey's Crossroads Homeless Shelter about providing a hypothermia shelter this winter. Cindy McLaughlin reported that the shelter will probably be at St. Barnabas' for a week in March during the evenings. A committee was begun to work with Cindy on this outreach effort.

The Vestry approved an Endowment Grant to ASYP for the purchase of a computer printer for the afterschool program.

Report on the Annual Pledge Drive

Following is an up-to-date report from the Stewardship, reflecting pledges received at the Annual Meeting.

Work on the annual pledge drive for 2018 began in July with the formation of the Stewardship Committee. Under Canon Flanagan's leadership parishioners Gil Baldwin, James Carroll, Maria Macfarlane, Molly Newling, and Grace Robbins rolled up their sleeves and started the "Journey to Generosity."

Your response was heartening and strengthens our future ability to minister to serve our community, the world, and each other through the love of Jesus Christ. As November 20 we have received 74 pledges for a total of \$325,573, an increase of 28% from last year.

The breakdown is:

New adult pledges	6
New youth pledges	2
Increases	50
Stayed the same	12
Decreases	4

This year special emphasis has been placed on developing stewardship in our children and youth. This will be a long-term effort and you will see the first steps on Advent I.

We are, of course, always open to receiving new pledges and are still contacting some people about making a commitment. If you asked for offering envelopes they will be available in early December. - Gil Baldwin, Stewardship Chair

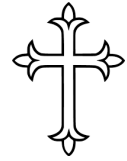

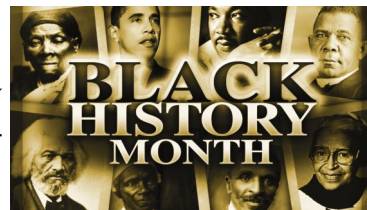

Annandale Christian Community for Action

ACCA sent seventeen hygiene kits to Church World Service to assist help respond to severe challenges in Puerto Rico after Hurricane Maria and other emergency needs worldwide. CWS reports that it has already sent 22,000 hygiene kits to Puerto Rico and is working to send another 5,000. The kits were assembled with supplies donated by CROP Walk participants and members of St. Barnabas and John Calvin Presbyterian Churches. The kits included hand towels and washcloths, toothbrushes, combs, soap, bandages, and nail clippers - CWS adds a long-lasting toothpaste. Thanks to everyone who donated supplies, and to Canon Flanagan for her donation to cover CWS costs for shipping and processing. Extras of donated supplies and items not on the CWS list will be given to the ACCA Food Pantry or the Baileys Shelter, or saved for a future CWS kit assembly.

Annandale CROP Hunger Walk donations raised by St. Barnabas' walkers total about \$3,000 as of mid-November. Thanks to everyone who donated, walked or volunteered. The February Reporter will include a report on funds raised by the Annandale walk and a final total for St. Barnabas. The funds help CWS fight hunger and poverty around the world, and ACCA also receives funds to help in our community.

ACCA has begun its annual Challenge Campaign with pledges of \$44,000 from anonymous donors. ACCA's goal is to raise \$120,000 through the campaign, which will be under way until the end of January 2018. During 2017, ACCA has assisted some 5,600 people in need. If you would like to make a donation to help ACCA continue to serve our neighbors who are less fortunate, you can do so by mailing a check to ACCA at 7200 Columbia Pike, Annandale VA 22003 (please note Challenge Campaign in the memo line). Pre-addressed envelopes and more information are available in the Narthex. You may also donate online using the Catalogue for Philanthropy or Pay Pal payment services (see <https://accacares.org/how-do-i-give/>)

St. Barnabas is scheduled to volunteer for the ACCA Furniture Ministry on December 2 (2017) and January 27, 2018. Our crew will deliver gently used furniture to needy households and pick up donated furniture. Volunteers should report to the furniture warehouse on the grounds of Annandale United Methodist Church, 6935 Columbia Pike, at 8 am.

The joint Shepherd's Center-ACCA transportation program provides rides to medical appointments. The program is seeking additional volunteer drivers.

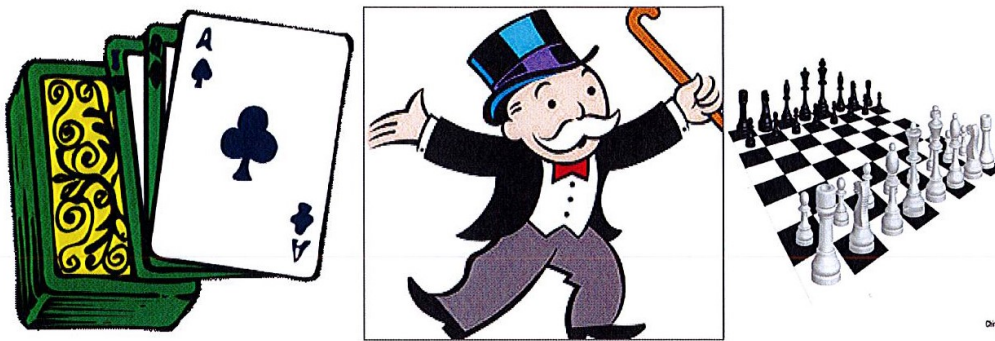
