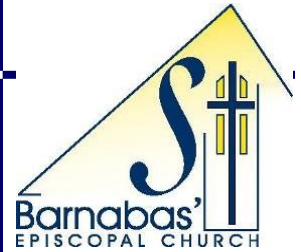

This spring I had several conversations with members of our parish who are parents of school age children. They were feeling pretty stressed. Many of them work outside the home, all of them have scheduling challenges with children who participate in activities, and all of them want their children to be nurtured and formed in the life of the church. The number of fund-raising activities needed to support our ministry with school age children threatens to burn out their parents. One mother said to me, "I am not good at event planning. I would rather put it in my pledge."

And so she should.

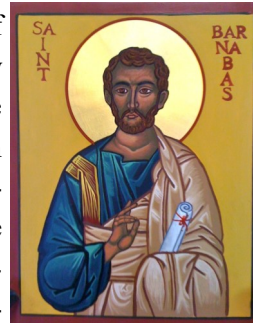
And so should we all.

We are stewards and trustees of God's plan for the salvation of the world. And that plan doesn't have a chance if we are burning out members of our congregation. We want to be good stewards of our congregation, our children and their parents, so we need to stop funding our critical ministries with fund-raisers. We are members of "a holy nation and a royal priesthood." We want to be eager and excited about our ministry. We want to be generous and compassionate and grateful trustees of all that God has entrusted to our care. Of course we want to put our resources in our pledges!

Some of you may remember the Robert Fulghum quote, "It will be a great day when our schools have all the money they need, and our air force has to have a bake-sale to buy a bomber." It was memorable because it made us aware of the respect we extend to the Air Force, and the relative lack of importance we ascribed to our schools at the time.

Our budget is a theological statement. We fund things that are a priority, and do not fund things we determine to be less important. In building a budget this year, we want to practice what we preach of course! We want to walk the talk. We plan to give our fair share to the Diocese first, joyfully, thankfully. We plan to give generously to support the outreach ministries that are essential to the mission of our church. We want to fund the ministries necessary to the spiritual formation of all our members, irrespective of age. We are building the future of our parish and its mission.

It put me in mind of a little girl, named Jody, who wrote a letter to her teacher, complete with many misspellings, that highlights how precious a gift it is to have a future. It goes like this.

**Vestry Highlights - August 2017**

Much of the time during the meeting was spent drafting a Vestry Statement on Stewardship. After reading and deliberating on Matthew 6:24-33 (No man can serve two masters...) we split into three groups to compose statements on what we believe, commit to and invite the congregation to do on Stewardship.

The kick off date for the Campaign will be October 8; Ingathering will be October 15.

One of the features of this year's Campaign will be working toward modeling and teaching our youth Stewardship practices, including regular giving, which will include providing donation envelopes to Church School Youth.

Other business included a report from the Finance Committee on the review of the restricted accounts of the Church, with a goal of consolidating or closing those no longer active. The Finance Committee also is planning a revision of the 2017 annual budget to reflect changes to the anticipated income and spending. The total income anticipated for the year is \$289,000, total expenses \$283,623.

## Three Attitudes Toward Giving

This fall we celebrate our progress on the Journey to Generosity, as individuals and as a parish. Following is an article by A. T. Mollogan, Jr., who served on the faculty at Virginia Theological Seminary for 39 years, and contributed to many special projects and committees in the National Church. In this article, he expresses three wide-spread attitudes about giving that warrant our consideration.



The "Dues" or "Fair Share" attitude: The first attitude is that of paying one's dues. The basic thought here is something like the following: "I am paying the equivalent of a membership fee, and in exchange for it I am receiving something from the church." The "something" could be a general warm feeling or it could be a deeply moving inspiration. It might be a sense of ensuring the availability of the pastoral offices, such as Baptism, Holy Matrimony, or Burial of the Dead. Or it could be that the "giver" wants to establish eligibility for other benefits, such as pastoral counseling. Another motivation might be to buy entrance into a beneficial moral environment, which will help in the upbringing of one's children.

Of course, nothing is wrong with wanting any of these things from the church. However, if the attitude of the person who is making a so-called gift to the church is that the person is only paying the fair share for what they are getting, then they are not really giving, they are only engaging in a purchase. While paying one's fair share for services received is more responsible than being a free-loader, it does not really deserve to be called giving. Moreover, there is plenty of biblical precedent for believing that a 'fair share' is ten percent of one's income.

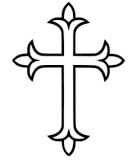

## The Women of St. Barnabas'

In September, the WOSB voted to give \$500 to the city of Houston for hurricane relief. We will give the money through Episcopal Relief & Development. We also will give \$200 to Phyllis McCoy who is raising money for a memorial to the service members who lost their lives in an air crash in 1961. Her brother, a new recruit, was one of the 74 soldiers on the plane. A historic marker has been approved by the Virginia Senate.

Treasurer Bonnie Baldwin gave us a schedule of our finances. So far in 2017, we have given \$6,400 to outreach/inreach, including large print Bibles to the Northern Virginia Mental Health Institute. In addition, Janet George has turned in \$65 to the Miles of Pennies charity, earmarking our funds to fight human trafficking. The jars in the narthex and in the Richardson Room are available for your contributions—but not only pennies. We will gladly accept larger coins, bills, and even checks (made out to WOSB with Miles of Pennies in the memo line)!

We now turn our energy to planning our Christmas Bazaar, to be held on Saturday, November 18. Nancy MacLachlan has donated many wooden sleighs to the Barnabees, and so we have decided to call this year's bazaar "A Santa's Sleigh Christmas." Ann Sayles and Sarah Kiely have volunteered to make jams for the bake sale. We are making Christmas ornaments, wreaths, trees, Christmas gift and wine bags, Dammitt dolls, and other Christmas crafts. We will have a raffle for Christmas hangings and a jewel tree.

As usual, we will have a Friday night preview on November 16 starting at 6:00 p.m. with complimentary wine and food. The preview is for members of St. Barnabas' and their guests. Please come enjoy the fellowship and help the WOSB do their good works.

## Three Attitudes Toward Giving *(continued from p. 3)*

The Program Oriented (or Goal-Oriented) Attitude. A second attitude is that of one whose giving is motivated principally by the desire to see some particular thing done, perhaps helping those who have a particular need. A giver whose motivation is, for instance, to support feeding of the poor, or to support activities of the Sunday school (especially when the giver has no children in the Sunday school), etc., is clearly giving charitably. One could refer to such giving as mission-motivated or, where applicable, as outreach-motivated. Such giving to benefit others is in accordance with the second of Jesus's summary commandments: "Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself."

Giving Out of Thankfulness and Love for God. A third attitude is that of the person who is giving to God in gratitude for what the person has received from God. Here, the attitude is one of thankfulness, and of returning out of plenteousness. In the ideal, this person is giving without attention to which of God's purposes the gift will be used for. The giver here is giving up any control over the gift, even indirect control. It is only when the giver totally releases control that the transfer can really be called a gift. Part of the giver's attitude may be that the giver never felt that they owned what they are giving away. Think of the idea that:

"All things come of Thee, O Lord; of Thine own have we given Thee."

The idea that all things belong to God is what Jesus had in mind when he said: "Render unto Caesar the things that are Caesar's; render unto God the things that are God's."

## Pledging at St. Barnabas' - A Short History

Over the years there has been a steady decline in the number of pledges and the total dollar amount of those pledges. But shockingly the average dollar amount of our pledges has also declined. Far from keeping pace with inflation we are operating with significantly less income. Some of the impacts are having one priest instead of two, reductions in parish activities, and significant cuts in outreach, including less support for the diocese and seminaries.

The high water mark for pledges was in 2010, with pledges made just over a year after the financial scares of late 2008. We were at our most generous in the face of that fear and uncertainty. Here is a comparison of pledging in 2010 and 2017.

Year	Adult Pledges	Dollars Pledged	Average Amount of Pledge
2010	113	\$367,924	\$3,607
2017	74	\$254,297	\$3,436

This downward trend is clearly not sustainable. In 2012 we celebrated our jubilee year, the 50th anniversary of St. Barnabas' founding. We are the trustees of this heritage. Without becoming more intentionally generous how do you think this parish will look on our 65<sup>th</sup> birthday in 2027?

## Beginnings Book Group

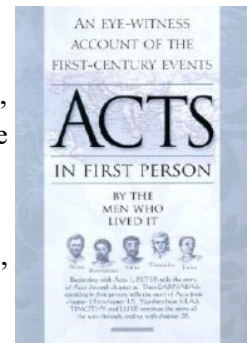

We have chosen two books that we feel may be of interest:

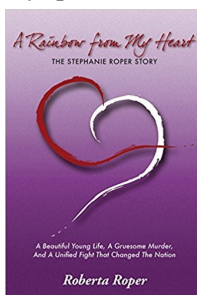

## A Letter from Phyllis McKoy

September 2017

Greetings My Dear St. Barnabas' Family and Friends,

Several of you may be aware and remember that I'm working on a project to obtain recognition and honor for 77 unsung heroes who perished in an airplane crash, November 8, 1961, on Imperial Airlines Flight 201/8, Richmond. Seventy-four Army recruits, including my older brother Michael, and 3 crew members were killed on that fateful flight, in the deadliest crash in Virginia's history at that time. To this day, there is no memorial in Virginia to honor these unsung heroes who gave the ultimate sacrifice.

The crash resulted in major positive changes in the aircraft industry as we know it today:

~The way DoD transports troops within the USA;

~Changes in the design of the airplane cabin;

~Fire retardant material added to airplanes;

~Safety checklists;

~Better maintenance, safety, and financial standards and regulations implemented in the airline industry; etc.

I would like to provide an update on the project and share some great news! Since 2011-2016, the Governors of Virginia have signed Proclamations to remember and honor the 77 who perished on Imperial Airlines Flight 201/8, on November 8, 1961, Richmond.

The Virginia Senate approved Virginia Resolution #104, January 2017, honoring the Army Recruits and crew members, and expressing sympathy for the loss of lives.

In addition, my application for an historic marker was approved by the Virginia Historic Resources Department, June 2017. (The site for the marker will be identified in the near future.)

If you would like to read more about Imperial Airlines Flight 201/8, feel free to google Imperial Airlines Flight 201/8, and/or research in the Richmond Times--Dispatch, Washington Post, and Virginia Aeronautical Historical Society, to name a few sources.

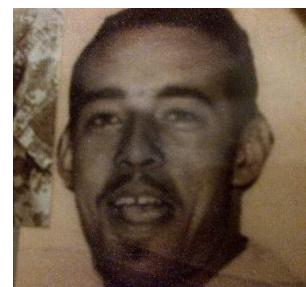

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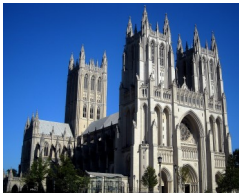
